GSP Items Featured in Stuttgart Exhibition

Three items belonging to the German Society are currently on loan to the Haus der Geschichte Baden Württemberg in Stuttgart as part of an exhibition titled, American Dreams: Ein neues Leben in den USA! The exhibition opened on November 17 and will run through July 28, 2024.

The exhibition, featuring around 200 original objects from gold rush nuggets to wooden pillows, tells the stories of 34 people from three centuries who all left the German southwest to start a new life in America.

The German Society's items which are being displayed are: a portrait of the first president of the GSP, Henry Keppele, Keppele's hand-written family register, and an Applicants' Ledger from the Society's "Agentur" Collection.

Hybrid Lecture: "German-Romance Language Contact in the Italian Alps"

Since ancient times, the Alps have been a transitional space between German(ic) and Latin/Italian cultures. This lecture, produced by the Max Kade Institute for German-American Studies, will introduce the citizen science AlpiLink project, which aims to document the Germanic and Romance dialects and minority languages spoken across the Alpine regions of Italy. The talk will feature recordings and images from centuries-old German speech islands and the surrounding Romance dialects.

Presenter <u>Stefan Rabanus</u> is Professor of German linguistics at the University of Verona in Italy. Trained at the universities of Mainz, Greifswald, and Marburg in Germany, his research interests include dialectology, the history of the German language, language contact, and digital humanities.
